

Someone recently asked how Sunrise Horse Farm started? At Christmas in 2006 a friend shared her passion for helping the youth as Kim Meeder was doing at Crystal Peaks Youth Ranch in Bend, OR. At that time Kim had written two books, Hope Rising and Bridge Called Hope. So a long story short we went out to Crystal Peaks for their Information Clinic in June of 2007, made the decision to forge ahead with Sunrise Horse Farm and we are listed under their Similar Ministries. Some of you attended our fundraiser in May of 2016 and heard Kim speak of her life, the tragedy that occurred when she was nine and how a pony changed her life. It has been over ten years since reading her book Hope Rising and I would like to share some of her words.

"So much of our life seems to just happen. We have all shared moments of throwing our hands in the air in utter dismay of a raucous day's offerings. Yet in reality, most of our life is what we choose for it to be. As violently as external forces push, we are still the master of our own will.

Difficulties, hurdles, hardships, whatever name we know them by, one thing is certain--they visit us all. No life is immune from suffering. As certain as we breathe, we will know pain. When you are surrounded, instead of anxiously looking from side to side, look up. Change your view with a new perspective. Look up and see what the Maker sees.

It is true, the pain that we feel in this life is certain. What is equally certain is how we choose to feel about the pain. It can destroy us--or define us. Like standing on a mountainous trail, we can choose which way to go. We can choose where we end up. When confronted by pain, we can choose to take the descending trail that most often leads to a dark and lonely place, pitted with mires of helplessness, hopelessness, despair.

Or we can select the ascending trail, and, with some effort and perseverance, we can choose to allow our pain to motivate us toward becoming better people, to move us toward a better place".

So whatever you are experiencing today, look to the Lord for your needs. He is faithful.

And I encourage you to read Hope Rising. It is filled with true stories of lives changed at Crystal Peaks Youth Ranch..a place where hope rises.

We are in need of volunteers to mentor the students, feed the horses, muck out the barn and various other chores. Please give us a call and make a difference in the life of someone.

**Q. I'm concerned about my heart health?
What questions I should ask my doctor?**

What can I do to improve my heart health?

Many lifestyle factors contribute to poor heart health (poor diet, smoking, sedentary lifestyle), so be honest with your provider when looking for guidance on heart health.

Am I at increased risk for heart disease or a heart attack?

Understanding your risk factors is the first step in improving your heart health. Some modifiable risk factors include:

- high blood pressure
- high blood cholesterol
- diabetes, pre-diabetes
- smoking
- being overweight or obese
- family history

What are the warning signs of a heart attack?

Common heart attack signs include:

- pressure, tightness, pain, or a squeezing or aching sensation in your chest or arms that may spread to your neck, jaw or back
- nausea, indigestion, heartburn or abdominal pain
- shortness of breath
- cold sweat
- fatigue
- lightheadedness or sudden dizziness

Is my blood pressure within normal range?

American Health Association (AHA) recommends that high blood pressure should now be treated earlier with lifestyle changes and possibly medication, at 130/80 mm Hg (rather than 140/90).

Is my blood cholesterol within normal range?

Blood cholesterol test reports show cholesterol levels in milligrams per deciliter of blood (mg/dL). Total cholesterol and HDL (good) cholesterol are among many factors your provider can use to predict your risk for a heart attack or stroke.

You should leave your appointment feeling confident that your heart health is in good hands with your health care provider. Becoming an informed, engaged partner in your health care is critical. Knowledge is power, especially when it comes to your heart health.



Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board November 9, 2017

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on November 9, 2017 at 6:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. Present were: Joe Cummings, Jerry Reis, Patty Schreiber, and Jack Siebert. Also present were: Stacey Barth, Brad Busse, Corey Hoppenrath, Leroy Krepline, JoAnn Mignon, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, Joe Tisler, Dustin Kasbaum, Rob Michaelson, Becky Busse, Sonja Knier-Collins and Ed Byrne.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cumming to approve the minutes of the October 12, 2017 meeting as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$247,885.65. Motion carried 4-0.

At 7:00 pm a public hearing was held for the proposed 2018 Budget. There were no comments or questions regarding the budgets.

Correspondence was presented from the Reedsville Housing Authority and the Eastshore Humane Assoc. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Cummings to appoint Maureen Glasow to a five (5) year term on the Housing Authority Board. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made to approve the 2018 Agreement with the Eastshore Humane Assoc. Motion carried 4-0.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth. Walt turned the meeting over to Reis at 6:37 pm. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to approve the First Responders 2018 Budget as presented in the amount of \$18,289.00. Motion carried 3-0. (Siebert abstained, Reis voted). A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Reis to approval the Applications from Michelle Foytik, Allison Weber, Karalyn Christel, Tiffany Stueber and Rajaune Kubik. Motion carried 3-0 (Schreiber abstained). Final approval will be given with passing of physicals and classes. Krahn explained background checks were completed. Reis turned the meeting back to Walt at 6:39 pm.

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Mignon. The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Hoppenrath. Discussions on the AT&T proposal, Water tower painting project, Northern Pipe Inc. insurance claim and sewer rates were postponed until the next regular scheduled Board meeting. MPU will monitor the manhole to the Mobile Home Park and Krahn will work on an ordinance for private sanitary sewer laterals. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Schreiber to approve the Sewer 2018

Budget as presented in the amount of \$327,789.00. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to approve the Water 2018 Budget as presented in the amount of \$402,200.00. Motion carried 4-0.

The Fire Dept. monthly written report was presented by Busse. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the Fire Dept 2018 Budget as presented in the amount of \$140,000. Motion carried 3-1 (Reis - Nay.)

The Public Works Dept monthly written report was presented by Krepline. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to approve the recommendation from Ayres Assoc to investigate the water main under the 4th Street Bridge with an estimated cost being \$1,000 to \$1,500.00. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to send letters to private entities where the Village sanded or salted their lots explaining that per the Municipal Agreement with the State we can no longer provide this service. Motion carried 4-0. Krepline explained that due to the poor condition of the Christmas light pole wraps, the DPW will not put them up.

Resolution 2017-4 naming Reis as the 3rd signer for banking purposes was introduced by Siebert. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Cummings to approve the Resolution as presented. Motion carried 3-0. (Reis abstained). A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to make an extra Deerview Drive loan payment in 2017. Motion carried 4-0.

Cummings explained that the meeting with the officers of both the First Responders and the Fire Dept has not been scheduled yet. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Reis to approve the General 2018 Budget as presented in the amount of \$1,212,376.00. Motion carried 4-0. Following a discussion a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to increase the building permit fee to \$40.00 for the first \$2,000.00. Motion carried 4-0. Schreiber volunteered to work with Siebert on the Sidewalk Ordinance and the Vacation Pay Policy for the next regular scheduled Board meeting.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, December 14, 2017 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 PM.
